LETTERS FROM THE IRVINE TRAINEES

We continue to report some testimonies written by our Irvine-sent and Irvine-related trainees regarding their enjoyment from their experience in the FTTA for the encouragement and exhortation of all the saints.

Hello, excellent ones!

Sorry I haven't had a chance to write you all this term but I've definitely been enjoying a lot of riches in the classes, especially our second year ones. In our Life and Service class two weeks ago, I was impressed by the brother's presentation of the last six words in Revelation 22:3: "and His slaves will serve Him." We were charged to pray-read these six words again and again because we need to see that *this is and will be our status for eternity*. The brother reminded us that we're in the training to get some training and perfecting to do what we should do and that is to serve Him. The following paragraphs are more or less verbatim some points that the brother shared with us.

TO SERVE HIM. We were made for that as an *earthen* vessel, we were saved for that as a *cleansed* vessel and we are being transformed for that as a *renewed* vessel. In eternity future, even as transformed stones, *we will still be slaves*. This describes our relationship with God. Today, He owns us with absolute rights

over us. We're not servants, hirelings or employees but slaves. It's a paradox but only a real slave to God is a real free man. We must pray-read this until it becomes our absolute reality. If this is in you, it will be very easy to know God's will because whatever He says, there will be nothing in us that resists and rebels against Him. A slave has no right to do that. We all have to come to that point. As our Master, He has the right to do anything yet as the most free and reasonable Person, God will never force us to do anything. God receives His service from willing, happy slaves. There are no chains except for the chains of love; there are no shackles except the shackles of mercy. If there were cells, they would be cells of grace. "And His slaves will serve Him."

Please continue to pray for us in the training, for our health and our hearts to be made willing by the Lord to continue receiving what He wants to dispense into us.

Dear Saints,

Praise the Lord! Coming into my fourth term in the training, this is still my declaration: Jesus is Lord! Although I had a wonderful time with everyone at Irvine, especially at the Summer Bible Camp, I feel very happy to be back in the Full-Time Training. I can't believe that I am in my last term. I just pray that the Lord would make more home in my heart and would gain every ground He desires before I graduate.

This past four weeks has not been easy for me. First, I had to take the GRE a week after the pre-training, which as some of you know, I was studying for my entire break at Irvine. I am glad that is done. I didn't want it to be a distraction in the training. But soon after that, I've been going through some health issues. It has not been easy to just focus on the Lord and His word, but I continue to press on!

This morning I had a fresh appreciation and enjoyment of Philippians 1:19, "For I know that for me this will turn out to salvation through your petition and the bountiful supply of the Spirit of Jesus Christ." What I enjoyed is that the boldness to say "I know that for me this will turn out to salvation," comes

from our willingness to open up to the Body whatever situation we are in. When we open to the Lord, He sends the supply and He sends it bountifully. But He may also lead us to open to the Body, which allows Him to send us more of His grace. This week I realized that to know the Lord requires me to not only open to Him but also to His members, because He and His members are one! Without knowing the Body, how can we truly know the Lord? Can we understand and experience the breadth and length and height and depth of the knowledge-surpassing love of Christ on our own? No, we apprehend it with all the saints! (Eph. 3:18-19). Oh I praise Him! I love the Lord and I love the Body of Christ!

[When I go to see the doctor, please] pray for that time, that the Lord would take care of every detail and that He would be with me every step of the way. It's nothing serious...not life-threatening or anything, but it does distract me from enjoying the Lord sometimes and the whole process of trying to find a way to take care of it makes me anxious when I'm not exercised in my spirit. MINISTRY PORTION FROM THE LIFE-STUDY OF COLOSSIANS

THE SEED AND THE LAND

The promise to Adam and Eve in Genesis 3 was the promise of the seed of the woman. But the promise God made to Abraham was not only that of the seed, but also that of the land. The seed promised in Genesis 3:15 becomes the land in Genesis 12. When the children of Israel entered into the land of Canaan, they inherited not only the seed, but also the land. We may interpret the seed both as a person and also as a seed sown into soil. This means that Christ is not only a descendant, but a seed sown into the land. Christ is both the seed and the land.

In Colossians do we have Christ as the seed or the land? In this book Christ is both the seed and the land. Colossians 2:7 says that we have been rooted in Christ. This indicates that He is the land. But in 3:4 we are told that

Christ is our life. This indicates that He is also the seed. However, in Colossians Christ is revealed more as the land than as the seed. Christ is our portion, our lot, our everything, just as the land was all things to the children of Israel. The land provided whatever the children of Israel needed: milk, honey, water, cattle, grain, minerals. In writing this Epistle, Paul employed the concept of the all-inclusive land in order to charge the misled Colossians not to take anything other than Christ Himself. Anything that is not Christ is related to the authority of darkness, and we should not accept it. Rather, we should simply remain in the good land and not allow any foreign element to come in. Christ alone is our portion, and we should accept only what is of Him. (*Life-Study of Colossians*—Message 6)
